


# Who Has More?

Circle the one who has more flowers.










# Play "Who Has More?" with Miffy and Poppy Pig!

**SET UP\***You will need





The characters on this page are Miffy and Poppy Pig.



## WHAT TO DO

First, ask your child to color in the page. Explain that this is a game called "Who Has More?" Ask: Can you tell if one friend has more flowers than the other friend? (Poppy Pig has more flowers.) Invite your child to count how many flowers Miffy has (4), and how many Poppy Pig has (6). Then ask: Can you circle the friend who has more flowers? Ask him or her to count Miffy's flowers, and compare that number with the number of Poppy Pig's flowers. Ask: Who has more flowers?

### **FOLLOWING UP**

Extend the "Who Has More?" game by asking questions such as: What could you do to make it so that Miffy has more flowers than Poppy Pig? (Draw more flowers for Miffy and then count to check.) What if Miffy and Poppy Pig each wanted to have 5 flowers? What if they each wanted 2 flowers?

## **LEARNING GOALS**

Demonstrating the mathematical concepts of "more than," "less than," and "the same number as;" demonstrating that the cardinal number of a set of counted objects is not changed by the rearrangement of those objects; developing concepts of number and quantity by identifying what makes up a set, counting to find the number of a set, and comparing the numbers of sets; providing practice with addition and subtraction.
