
Who Has More?

Circle the one who has more tomatoes.




Play "Who Has More?" with Miffy and Barbara!

SET UP*You will need





The characters on this page are Miffy and Barbara.



WHAT TO DO

First, ask your child to color in the page. Explain that this is a game called "Who Has More?" Ask: Can you tell if one friend has more tomatoes than the other friend? (Barbara has more tomatoes.) Invite your child to count how many tomatoes Miffy has (6), and how many Barbara has (7). Then ask: Can you circle the friend who has more tomatoes? Ask him or her to count Miffy's tomatoes, and compare that number with the number of Barbara's tomatoes. Ask: Who has more tomatoes?

FOLLOWING UP

Extend the "Who Has More?" game by asking questions such as: What could you do to make it so that Miffy has more tomatoes than Mother Bunny? (Draw more tomatoes for Miffy and then count to check.) What if Miffy and Mother Bunny each wanted to have 7 tomatoes? What if they each wanted 3 tomatoes?

LEARNING GOALS

Demonstrating the mathematical concepts of "more than," "less than," and "the same number as;" demonstrating that the cardinal number of a set of counted objects is not changed by the rearrangement of those objects; developing concepts of number and quantity by identifying what makes up a set, counting to find the number of a set, and comparing the numbers of sets; providing practice with addition and subtraction.
