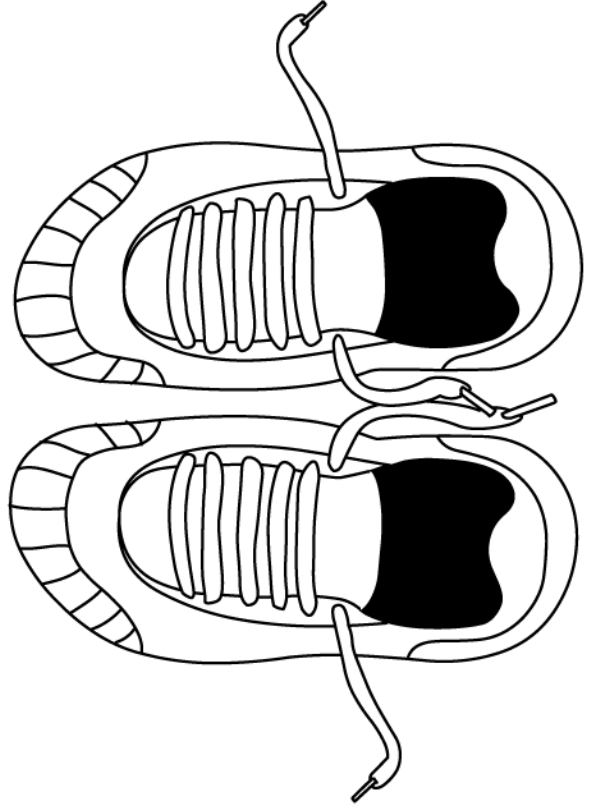




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What's inside these shoes?



Invite your child to color the pictures, then fold the paper in quarters so the shoes are on the outside. Then ask your child "What's inside?" and open the card to reveal the feet.

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# What's Inside? – Shoes

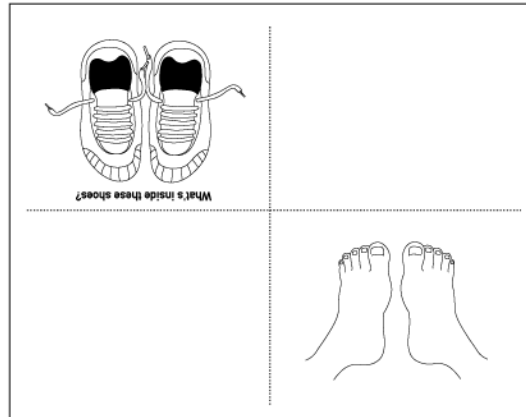
Fold the paper to make a picture riddle.

## WHAT TO DO

Discuss with your child what the pictures on the page are (shoes and feet). Talk about how the two pictures relate to each other. Then have your child color them.

Fold the paper in quarters, or help your child fold it, so that you can see the picture of the shoes on the outside of the card, and the feet appear on the inside of the card when you open it.

Ask the riddle: **What's inside shoes?** Your child can open the card to reveal the answer.

## FOLLOWING UP

Ask: **How many shoes are there? How many feet? Why is that? If a cat wore shoes, how many would it need? What about a bird? A snake? An ant?**
