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What's inside the peapod?



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Invite your child to color the pictures, then fold the paper in quarters so the peapod is on the outside. Then ask your child "What's inside?" and open the card to reveal the peas.

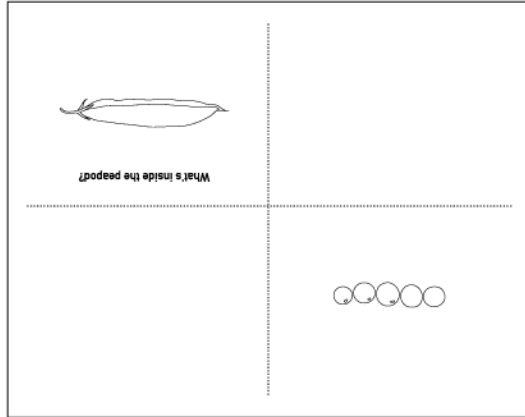
Fold the paper to make a picture riddle.

WHAT TO DO

Discuss with your child what the pictures on the page are (a peapod and peas). Talk about how the two pictures relate to each other. Then have your child color them.

Fold the paper in quarters, or help your child fold it, so that you can see the picture of the peapod on the outside of the card, and the peas appear on the inside of the card when you open it.

Ask the riddle: **What's inside a peapod?** Your child can open the card to reveal the answer.

FOLLOWING UP

Ask: **How many peas are there here? How many peapods? Are there any other vegetables that we can find inside a skin? What about fruits? Do we usually eat the skin of something like a banana? Why is that?**
