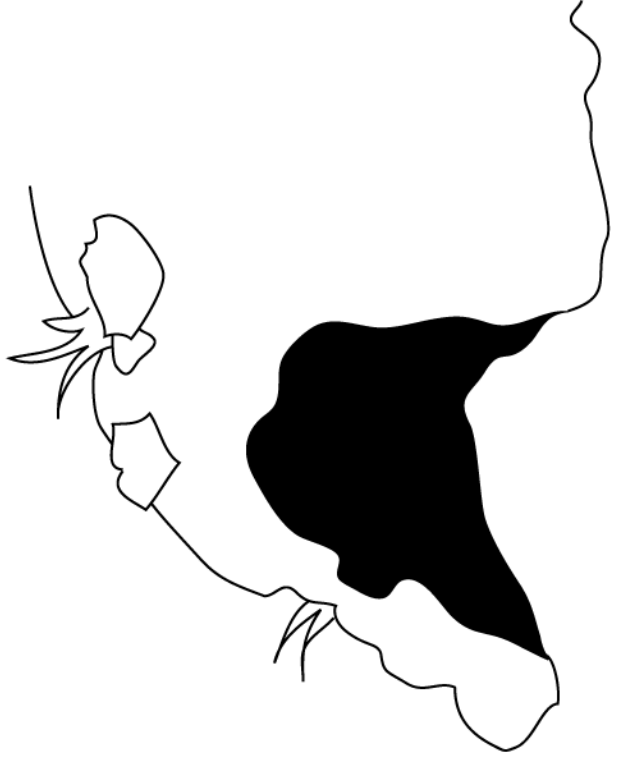


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What's inside the cave?



Invite your child to color the pictures, then fold the paper in quarters so the cave is on the outside. Then ask your child "What's inside?" and open the card to reveal the bear.

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What's Inside? – Cave

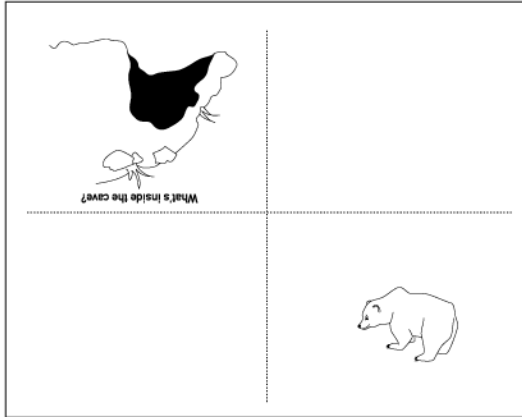
Fold the paper to make a picture riddle.

WHAT TO DO

Discuss with your child what the pictures on the page are (cave and bear). Talk about how the two pictures relate to each other. Then have your child color them.

Fold the paper in quarters, or help your child fold it, so that you can see the picture of the cave on the outside of the card, and the bear appears on the inside of the card when you open it.

Ask the riddle: **What's inside a cave?** Your child can open the card to reveal the answer.

FOLLOWING UP

Ask: **What else could be inside a cave? Have you ever been in a cave?**
