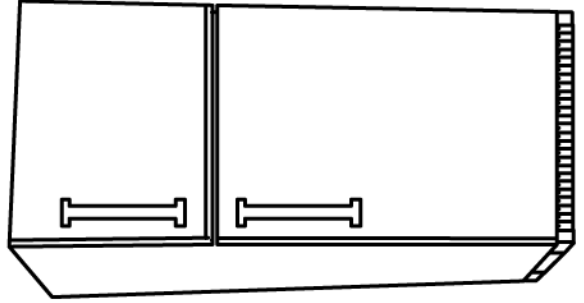


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What's inside the refrigerator?

Invite your child to color the pictures, then fold the paper in quarters so the refrigerator is on the outside. Then ask your child "What's inside?" and open the card to reveal the food.

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# What's Inside? – Refrigerator

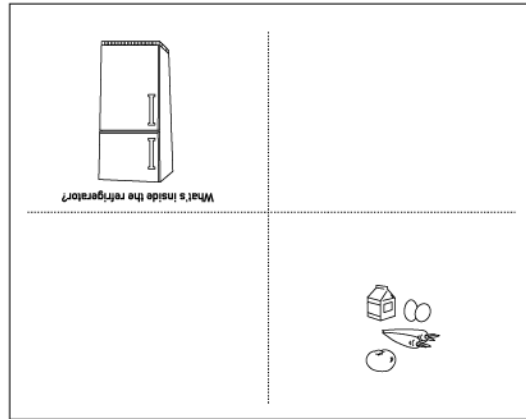
Fold the paper to make a picture riddle.

## WHAT TO DO

Discuss with your child what the pictures on the page are (refrigerator and food items). Talk about how the two pictures relate to each other. Then have your child color them.

Fold the paper in quarters, or help your child fold it, so that you can see the picture of the refrigerator on the outside of the card, and the food appears on the inside of the card when you open it.

Ask the riddle: **What's inside a refrigerator?** Your child can open the card to reveal the answer.

## FOLLOWING UP

Ask: **Why do people keep food in a refrigerator? Do we put anything that isn't food in our refrigerator? What are the different foods in this picture? Which ones do you like to eat? How many carrots are there? How many eggs? How many things to drink?**
