What you need:

- imagination
- video camera
- videotape





What you do:

- Brainstorm ideas about the subject and style for your video.
- 2 Calculate how long each scene can be if the whole video is only two minutes. (That's the ZOOM limit.)
- **3 Write** down what you want people to say. Make sure any titles or captions are easy to read and leave enough time for the viewer to read each word twice.
- 4 Recruit a crew that includes: a camera operator, actor(s), and someone to take care of sound, lighting, and props. In a pinch, one person can actually do all this.
- **5 Scout** out your shooting locations to see if they're quiet, have enough **light** and a good place to put the camera.

- Rehearse your video to make sure it's only two minutes and there aren't any funny shadows or objects in the background. **Experiment** with camera angles and different ways to follow the action.
- **Press** record and count to five before starting to shoot. If you need to reshoot a scene, just **rewind** and start over. You can hit the "pause" button to avoid wasting tape.
- 8 Watch it to find out if any part is too long, too dark, too noisy, or too shaky. Make sure you can hear the dialogue and read signs you made. If there's stuff you can do better **re-tape** it.

- Make a copy of your video to keep for yourself. Run a cable from your camera to a VCR. Push PLAY on the camera (where your original footage is) and **RECORD** on the VCR (where your blank tape is).
- Throw your own **movie** premiere! Invite some friends over, put on your fancy clothes, pop some popcorn, and show your movie. Pat yourself on the back-you're a star!







★ Camera Tips:

Decide which **special effects** you want to use. To focus, use automatic focus or zoom all the way in, **focus** on an object, and then **zoom** back out.

Read your owners manual.

★ Lighting Tips:

If it's **too dark** in the viewfinder (the eye piece), it's too dark to see. **Add** some lamp or sunlight--but not too much. Strong **light** will also make the picture dark in the viewfinder.

★ Sound Tips:

- * To do a **sound check**, shoot the actors saying lines. Play back the video you just shot right in the camera by listening to it with headphones. Be sure you **hear** dialogue **clearly**.
- * If you shoot inside, find a room off a **quiet** hallway. Use a room with a carpeted floor (or put a rug or blanket on the floor to **muffle the echo**.)
 Close the door.
- * **Post signs** outside the room asking people to be quiet or have someone guard **against loud** voices and footsteps. Shoot your video when there aren't many people around.

- If you shoot outside, microphones can pick up the wind. It sounds like static from a radio. Do a sound check. If you hear loud wind noise, shoot inside until the wind stops.
- While shooting, turn off air conditioners, televisions, telephones, computers, or anything else that makes noise including watches that beep.
- * Your camera probably has a built-in **microphone**. Point the camera directly at the person who is **speaking** and keep the camera no more than three to five feet away.



Video Requirements for ZOOM:

- Mail the **original tape** (no copies) **labeled** with your name, address, and title of your video.
- Protect your tape with lots of padding when you mail it.
- 3 Use any video **format** (VHS, 3/4 inch, Beta, Hi-8, mini-DV, and DVD.)
- 4 Limit the video length to less than two minutes.
- **5 Film** a few seconds of **black** between videos on your tape (if you make more than one.)
- 6 Cover or **remove any logos**, brand names, or other images that are copyrighted (such as the Nike® Swoosh.)

- 7 Keep your videos **G-rated** (no violence, bad language, sex, smoking or drugs.)
- 8 Turn-off the **timestamp** option if your camera has one.
- Speak in any language (sign language too) and include a written translation in English.
- Do a **sound check** to make sure you can hear the dialogue clearly on your videotape.
- Make sure you can **see** what you're filming **clearly** in the viewfinder.
